6. Neighbourhood Plan

A letter has been received from James Cartlidge MP asking for Parish Councils to revert if they are working on a Neighbourhood plan. The government have proposed new planning reforms and James Cartlidge is concerned about the potential impact that these will have on the legal status of Neighbourhood plans. The

- Chairman advised HSM had a Neighbourhood plan approx. 15 years ago but this was not renewed so is not valid anymore. The last time a Neighbourhood plan was undertaken the cost was between £2,000 – £3,000 and required a lot of time and work. The Chairman asked the Cllrs to consider whether a new Neighbourhood plan is needed and this is to be discussed again at November's meeting.
