Three Councils For Suffolk: Big enough to deliver, local enough to care

The five district and borough councils of Suffolk, Babergh, East Suffolk, Ipswich, Mid Suffolk, and West Suffolk, have launched our joint Three Unitary Councils for Suffolk proposal, a locally led plan to reshape local government and deliver stronger, more responsive services to communities across the county. Our proposal was officially launched, along with our website https://threecouncilsforsuffolk.org, on 7th August.

Although we have consistently concentrated on taking a positive approach promoting the benefits of our proposal, it does seem that our opponents are expending their energies on waging a campaign of disinformation against the Three Unitary model. This does seem to be crystallising around the subject of council tax and there have been and will be some quite extreme claims. We will be publishing soon some likely scenarios for how council tax will be harmonised (we can't say for sure as this will be a matter for the new councils) but it won't mean rises above the current annual limits.

There is a public meeting in Raydon at 7pm on 2nd September and another in Hadleigh at 6pm on 8th September. These will give residents the chance to learn more about local government reorganisation and ask questions.

The final Three Unitary Case for Change will be going to all council meetings later this month for final approval prior to submission to government on the 26th.

Suffolk routes revealed for opening stages of Lloyds Tour of Britain Men

The two stage routes that will open this year's Lloyds Tour of Britain Men in East Suffolk and Mid Suffolk and Babergh, have been revealed, that will see the world's top cyclists pass through dozens of communities and cover more than 300 kilometres of Suffolk roads. Stage two on 3rd September will be hosted by our districts, starting at 11am in Stowmarket.

Residents of Higham, Holton (Bacon's Green), Raydon and Upper Layham will get the opportunity to watch as it passes through at about 2.15pm, but we can all watch the live broadcast on ITV4 throughout the day.
